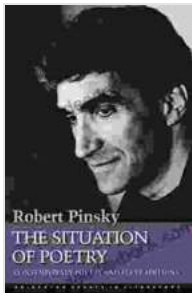

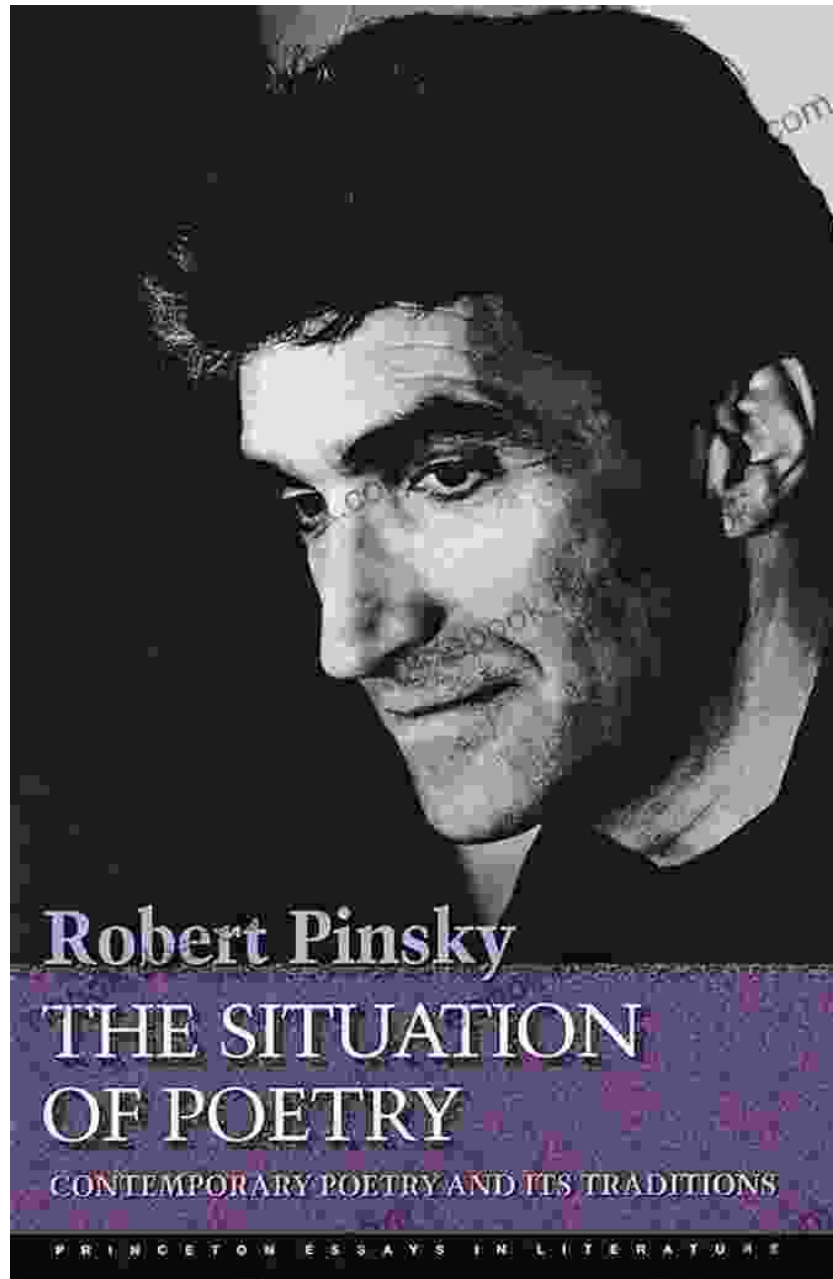

as if to make amends

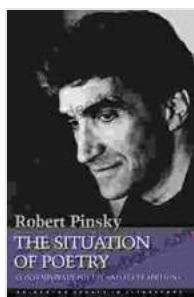

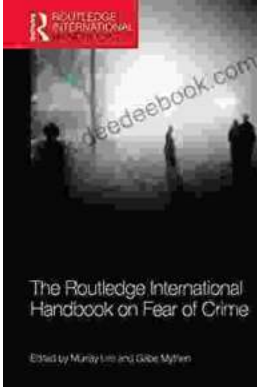

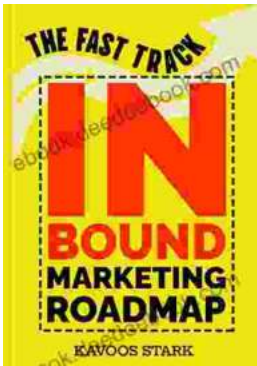
