

Sunflower Crochet Pattern: Crochet Flower Pattern Modern Irish Crochet Lace

Sunflowers are beautiful, cheerful flowers that symbolize joy and happiness. They are also a popular motif in crochet, and for good reason! Crocheted sunflowers are beautiful and versatile, and can be used to create a variety of items, from blankets and throws to cushions and bags.

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This sunflower crochet pattern is easy to follow, even for beginners. The pattern uses basic crochet stitches, and the instructions are clear and concise. You will need to know how to chain, double crochet, and slip stitch. If you are new to crochet, there are many helpful resources available online and in libraries.

Once you have mastered the basic stitches, you can begin crocheting your sunflower. The pattern includes instructions for making the center of the flower, the petals, and the leaves. The center of the flower is made with a

granny square, and the petals are made with a sunburst motif. The leaves are made with a simple slip stitch pattern.

When you have finished crocheting your sunflower, you can use it to create a variety of items. You can make a blanket by crocheting a number of sunflowers and joining them together. You can also make a cushion by crocheting a sunflower and sewing it onto a piece of fabric. Or, you can make a bag by crocheting a sunflower and attaching it to a strap.

No matter how you choose to use it, this sunflower crochet pattern is sure to bring joy and happiness into your life.

Materials

- Worsted weight yarn in your desired color(s)
- Crochet hook in size H (5.00 mm)
- Yarn needle
- Scissors

Abbreviations

- ch = chain
- dc = double crochet
- sl st = slip stitch

Pattern

Center

1. Ch 4, join with a sl st to form a ring.

2. Ch 3, 2 dc in ring, ch 1, 3 dc in ring, ch 1, 3 dc in ring, ch 1, 3 dc in ring. Join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
3. Ch 3, 2 dc in each ch-1 space around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
4. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
5. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, dc in next ch-1 space * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
6. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
7. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, dc in next ch-1 space * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
8. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.

Petals

1. Ch 3, join with a sl st to any corner of the center.
2. Ch 3, 2 dc in same corner, ch 1, 3 dc in next corner, ch 1, 3 dc in next corner, ch 1, 3 dc in last corner. Join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
3. Ch 3, 2 dc in each ch-1 space around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
4. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.

5. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, dc in next ch-1 space * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
6. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
7. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next ch-1 space, ch 1, dc in next ch-1 space * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
8. Ch 3, * 2 dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
9. Fasten off yarn and weave in ends.

Leaves

1. Ch 3, join with a sl st to any corner of the center.
2. Ch 3, dc in same corner, ch 1, dc in next corner, ch 1, dc in next corner, ch 1, dc in last corner. Join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
3. Ch 3, 2 dc in each ch-1 space around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
4. Ch 3, * dc in next dc, ch 1, dc in next dc * repeat around, join with a sl st to the top of the first ch 3.
5. Fasten off yarn and weave in ends.

Finishing

Once you have crocheted all of the motifs, you can join them together to create a blanket or other item. To join the motifs, simply slip stitch them

together around the edges. You can also use a yarn needle to sew the motifs together.

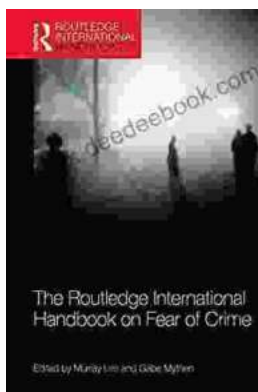
Your sunflower crochet project is now complete! Enjoy your beautiful creation!



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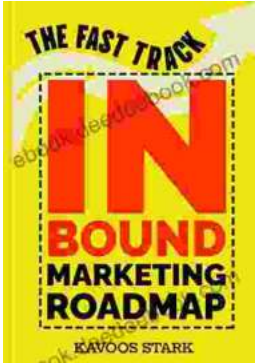
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
